# Supporting our Students

Tuition covers general operating costs for Isle of Wight Academy (such as teacher salaries, utilities and buses) but in order to provide the best experience for the students, IWA raises funds for many different purposes to help support the needs of our students.

## ANNUAL GIVING FUND

IWA's **Annual Giving Fund** supports unrestricted or restricted gifts. Unrestricted gifts to this fund allow IWA to allocate the money where it is most needed. Donor directed restricted gifts may be used to help fund specific items and projects.



## CAPITAL GIVING FUND

IWA's **Capital Giving Fund** supports various capital improvements. Gifts to this fund allow IWA to make improvements to the physical campus.



## PTO FUNDRAISERS

The PTO holds several fundraisers over the course of the year. This group funds requests from teachers for classroom items that are not included in the school's budget. The PTO also supports various needs throughout the campus such as technology or library needs and provides scholarships to graduating seniors. The PTO traditionally holds these fundraisers:

- Harvest Festival (Fall) \*Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the traditional Harvest Festival will not be held this year
- Boosterthon (Spring)
- Santa's Corner

## FOR THE KIDS GALA DINNER AND AUCTION

This annual event helps provide funding for various capital projects at IWA as well as technology and classroom needs. Past proceeds from this event have enabled IWA to purchase SMART boards and Chromebooks, to install new bleachers in the Jester Gym, to construct and furnish the Early Learning Center, and to renovate the Vaughan Gym, the bathrooms on campus, and the library.



## ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

This group covers the cost of Middle School and Upper School sports teams and sporting events as well as the majorettes. They hold several fundraisers to help support these programs:

- Golf Tournament
- IWA clothing sales
- BBQ Sales
- Concession and gate money from hosting athletic events





### PIG FEAST

The funds from this event each spring go into the general capital fund to help with improvements such as locker room renovations, landscaping, and other improvements on campus.



### ACADEMIC/SERVICE CLUBS, CLASSES

Some groups such as the Key Club, JSCO, SCO, and Science Club may sell items such as candles or doughnuts to raise funds to help defray costs of projects or trips for their groups. Additionally, every year there are groups that are part of IWA's foreign language department that take trips to enrich their educational experience. The Freshman class hosts the Talent Show each year to raise funds for events their Junior and Senior years like the Prom and Ring Dance.







