Dear Charger Family, congratulations on making it through the first six weeks of the school. Thank you all for your support as we have had a successful launch to the 2021-22 academic year. Here are a few things to be aware of for the month of October. Proper mask usage amongst the student body remains high as our students are doing what is necessary to continue with in person instruction. Please get vaccinated if eligible and have your children vaccinated if or when they become eligible. Vaccines shorten the amount of time a student must be quarantined in the event of an exposure and lessen the symptoms of those infected.

The cheer, cross country, football and volleyball teams are well into their seasons. It is great seeing them back on the field, court, or on the course. There have been few issues with COVID and our student athletes, unlike last winter. We currently have zero student athletes quarantined. A quick reminder that spectators of indoor contests are required to properly wear a mask while indoors on school property. Currently VISAA (athletics) is discussing making vaccines mandatory for all winter varsity athletes. I will update you as soon as a decision is made.




Second graders have been using building cubes and dice to create addition problems to practice the skill of counting on when adding.




Our 2nd grade World Studies students researched and made their own Australian animals with Mrs. Blythe.


