

The IWA faculty held a baby shower for Mrs. Blythe and Mrs. McCormick. We can't wait to meet the newest additions to their families and our Charger family!







In World Studies class with Mrs. Blythe, our Kindergarten students made masks of animals that they would see if they were on an African safari.















First grade showed us you can even do hands on subtraction using your feet (to hop)!Mrs. Barlow and Ms. Olson's classes have worked on many way to practice subtraction. The classes went to stations where they had a giant number line to hop on, could build and break away with blocks, and could roll and subtract with dice.











Ms. Olson's class has been working on fact vs. opinion in reading. They have been writing their opinions and thought it would be fun to have a taste test. The class tasted chocolate chip cookies and sugar cookies and then wrote their opinions of which cookie was the best. Sugar cookie was the class favorite!





First grade had so much fun with this STEM activity trying to build the tallest pumpkin house out of toothpicks and candy pumpkins. We think their houses are very impressive!








Second grade has been studying Earth's natural resources. When it was time to learn about soil, they made their very own edible soil. They discussed (and ate) a variety of layers including bedrock, parent material, subsoil, topsoil and organic material.











Mrs. Napier's Ninth Grade English classes are reading about the pets evacuated after Hurricane Katrina hit New Orleans. The created pet evacuation plans and procedures.





Mrs. Barnes-Smith's Earth Science class has been learning about minerals and rocks. They finished the unit with a rock cycle review lab which highlighted the three main types of rocks and how they are formed. Students used Starburst candy to replicate parts of the cycle. First, they cut the Starburst into small pieces to symbolize the formation of sediment through weathering and erosion. Next, they used their hands to replicate the process of lithification which results in the formation of sedimentary rocks. They then continued to use their hands and books to apply heat and pressure to their "sedimentary rock" to change it into a metamorphic rock. Lastly, they used a hot plate to melt their "metamorphic rocks" into magma that they then watched cool into an igneous rock.
